United Derby Democrats Endorse Coppolo for Mayor

Grandfather William Raro, Sr. and grandmother Frances Raro continued the family business. They passed it to Brian's uncle, William Raro, Jr. Brian stated: "Coming from a family-owned business has taught us all the value of customer service by being attentive to the needs of our friends, neighbors, and customers. We are forever grateful for the lessons taught to us by these hard-working people I am proud to call my family.'

Service to the City of Derby goes far back in Brian's family. James McMahon, his great-grandfather, was a Supernumerary Police Officer in the City of Derby during the years after World War II.

Mr. McMahon's daughter, Joan McMahon Coppolo, Brian's grandmother, is a brilliant pianist. She was Choir Director at St. Mary Church and organist at the First Congregational Church for nearly fifty years. She operates the Edgewood School of Music and has taught hundreds to play the piano over her long career. She was married to Ernest "Ernie" Coppolo who passed away many years ago. "My 'Nan' has always been there for me in my life. She has been critical to so many organizations for whom she played and entertained. She is exceptionally talented and is an inspiration to all of us who know and love her," reflected Brian.

Allen Coppolo and Sharon Raro met while Allen was working at Raro's Automotive Center, and the rest is history. They are the proud parents of Brian and his brother Daniel who is an information technology professional working in Brooklyn, NY. Brian has deep roots in Derby with a long family history of service to our community. Brian Coppolo stands on firm ground, with solid values, to lead our city to a more prosperous future.


